**ORDER DECLARING
URBAN EARTH DAY 2005
“EXPRESSIONS OF GOOD DESIGN”
FESTIVAL**

ORDERED, that Friday, April 22, 2005, is hereby declared as “Urban Earth Day 2005: Expressions of Good Design Festival”;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, the City Manager is authorized to grant a revocable permit to the Mid-Town Community Policing Center and the Earth Day Committee, pursuant to Secs. 25-26 through 25-30 of the Portland City Code, for the following activities:

live music, interactive art, arts and crafts for children, local artists displaying their wares, Maine agricultural processor and retailer booths, informational and educational exhibits promoting alternative energies and transportation, with bio-diesel-fueled and solar vehicles on display;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the above activities shall take place between 11 a.m. and 6 p.m., in Congress Square and the surrounding area, with setup to begin at 9 a.m. and breakdown finished by 7 p.m.;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that Congress Street (between Forest Avenue and High Street) will be posted "no parking" during the event;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that Congress Street (both lanes between Forest Avenue and High Street) be closed to vehicular traffic from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that under no circumstances may alcoholic beverages be sold on the streets or public property;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that expenses incurred by City departments for said event and permit and license fees shall be waived;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Festival area will be closed to street vendors pursuant to Section 19-17 of the Portland City Code and the City Manager is authorized to issue such other temporary licenses for the Festival, including licenses for food service establishments and permits for sale of non-food items, provided that all applicable requirements of the Code have been met.
