ORDER DECLARING 2004 VETERANS DAY PARADE AND CEREMONY AS A FESTIVAL

ORDERED, that the annual Veterans' Day Parade to be held on Thursday, November 11, 2004 is hereby declared as a Festival;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Harold T. Andrews Post No. 17 is hereby authorized to hold its annual Veterans Day Parade on Thursday, November 11, 2004, from 10:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m., said parade to take place on Congress Street from Mellen Street to Franklin Arterial, with the formation area starting at 9:30 a.m. at Longfellow Square, including State Street (from Park Avenue to Congress Street);

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the following streets will be closed to vehicular traffic on November 11 for the times designated:

9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.:

Congress Street from Mellen to Franklin Arterial;
Dow Street from Brackett to Congress;
State Street from Cumberland Avenue to Congress;

10:15 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

High Street from Spring to Congress;
Forest Avenue from Cumberland Avenue to Congress;
Casco Street from Shepley to Congress;
Center Street from Free to Congress;
Preble Street from Cumberland Avenue to Congress;
Temple Street from Federal to Congress;
Chestnut Street from Cumberland Avenue to Congress;

10:15 – 1:00 p.m.

Congress Street from Temple Street to Franklin Street Art; and
such other streets as deemed necessary by the Portland Police Department.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that State Street, both sides, (from Park Avenue to Congress Street) will be posted “no parking” on Thursday November 11, 2004 from 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Veterans Day Parade will be closed to vendors pursuant to section 19-17 of the City Code;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the City Manager is authorized to issue such other temporary licenses, including licenses for food establishments, as may be required by the City Code, provided that all other applicable requirements of said Code have been met.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that all Departmental expenses related to the Festival and license fees are hereby waived;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Harold T. Andrews Post No. 17 shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Portland, its officers and employees, from and against all claims arising out of or resulting from the festival and/or use of City streets and property for said festival, and shall procure and maintain public liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$400,000 combined single limit for personal or bodily injury, death or property damage and covering the obligation of indemnification hereunder. The Post shall provide the City with a certificate showing evidence of such insurance and showing the City as an additional insured on said insurance.
