**ORDER DECLARING  
HABITAT FOR HUMANITY'S  
"OPERATION HOME DELIVERY"**

**ORDERED**, that 9 a.m. Wednesday, May 3, 2006 through 5 p.m. Saturday May 6, 2006 is hereby declared a Festival, as Habitat for Humanity's "Operation Home Delivery";

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the Marginal Way Parking Lot is the Festival zone, as follows:

- \* approximately 2/3 of the Marginal Way Parking Lot will be set aside for their home building project, by means of snow fences or barricades;
- \* volunteers will be positioned at the entrances;
- \* the home building area will be posted "no parking" on Tuesday, May 2, 2006, with setup for the Festival on May 3 and 4<sup>th</sup> and home building on May 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>; and
- \* public access to recycle containers will be maintained;

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that Habitat for Humanity intends to build two 1,000 square foot homes (minus the windows and drywall) in the Festival area, to send down to Mississippi to be used as shelter for Habitat-qualified, hurricane victims;

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the Festival area will be closed to street vendors pursuant to Section 19-17 of the Portland City Code and is reserved for the use of Habitat for Humanity for the purpose of conducting Operation Home Delivery, subject to the direction and control of the City Manager;

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is hereby authorized to issue a revocable permit under §§25-26 -- 25-30 of the Portland City Code to Habitat for Humanity, the subject to the following conditions:

- \* Under no circumstances may alcoholic beverages be sold on City of Portland rights-of-way in the festival area during said event;
- \* The Habitat for Humanity shall defend and indemnify and hold harmless, the City, its officers and employees, from and against all claims arising out of or related to Festival activities and use of City property, and shall take out and maintain public liability insurance coverage in the

amount of at least \$400,000 combined single limit for personal or bodily injury, death or property damage and naming the City as an additional insured thereon for said purposes;

\* Habitat for Humanity shall have sole authority over participating vendors at the event and may charge a fee to vendors for the opportunity to vend at the Operation Home Delivery Festival.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is also authorized to issue such other temporary licenses, including licenses for food service establishments, as may be required by the Portland City Code, provided that all other applicable requirements of said Code have been met regarding the operation of said festival/event.
