**ORDER DECLARING 2005 ANNUAL UNITED WAY
CAMPAIGN KICK-OFF CELEBRATION AS FESTIVAL**

ORDERED, that the 2005 Annual United Way Campaign Kick-Off Celebration (the United Way Walk) scheduled for Thursday, September 8, 2005, from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. be and hereby is declared a festival, with a Kick-Off Celebration at the Monument Square/One City Center area at 12:00 noon;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that Federal Street Extension at Congress Street be closed to traffic on Thursday, September 8, from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. and be posted "no parking", and that Deering Oaks Park be closed to vehicular traffic from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (In the event of rain, the Street and Park will not be need to be closed as activities will be held indoors at the Cumberland County Civic Center);

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the Monument Square/One City Center area and sidewalks be closed to street vendors pursuant to Sec. 19-17 of the City Code;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the City Manager be and hereby is authorized to issue a revocable street occupancy permit pursuant to §25-27 and for the United Way Walk and Kick-Off Celebration, subject to the following terms and conditions:

*Under no circumstances shall alcoholic beverages be sold on the streets or public property during the Festival;

*United Way shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all claims arising out of activities during said Festival and shall provide and maintain public liability insurance coverage in the minimum limit of \$400,000, combined single limit for personal or bodily injury, death, or property damage, with the City of Portland as an additional insured thereon;

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the City Manager is authorized to issue such other temporary licenses, including licenses for food service establishments, as may be required by the City Code, provided that all other applicable Code requirements for the operation of the Festival have been met.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, City departments will not charge the United Way of Greater Portland for services provided on that day.
