**ORDER APPROVING “STORYCORPS, RECORDING ORAL HISTORY”  
AT CONGRESS SQUARE STAGE AREA  
AND DECLARING FESTIVAL**

**ORDERED**, that Blunt Youth Radio/WPMG are authorized to park a mobile StoryCorps recording booth at Congress Square from August 29-September 26, 2006 (the exact location) in back of the stage, beside the brick building), to record oral histories of Portlanders as part of the largest oral history project in the history of the United State and declaring such use a Festival; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is authorized to issue a revocable permit under Section 25-27 of the Portland City Code subject to the following conditions:

- (1) WPMG/Blunt Youth Radio shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all claims arising out of activities during said event, and shall take out and maintain public liability insurance coverage in the amount of at least \$400,000 combined single limit for personal or bodily injury, death, or property damage for said purposes. This insurance certificate will also list the City of Portland as an additional insured in regards to the StoryCorps, Recording Oral History Festival and its activities;
- (2) Under no circumstances may alcoholic beverages be sold or consumed on the streets or public property of said area during said festival; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that a few parking meters in front of Congress Square be posted “no parking” on the day the trailer arrives, and that police officers assist by holding back traffic while the trailer is maneuvered into place; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that permit fees for the use of the square are waived as well as the electricity fee; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is also authorized to issue such other temporary licenses, including licenses for food service establishments, as may be required by the Portland City Code, provided that all other applicable requirements of said code have

been met regarding the operation of this event.
