### **ORDER APPROPRIATING \$11,000,000 FOR VARIOUS ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROJECTS AND IMPROVEMENTS**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Subject to paragraph 2 below, The sum of Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) is hereby appropriated for energy efficiency projects and improvements to be implemented through various energy control measures constructed and installed at a variety of municipal and school facilities throughout the City, which energy control measures are more specifically identified as follows:
  - Lighting Upgrades and Controls
  - Boiler Upgrades
  - Barron Center - New Hot Water Boilers
  - Heating Controls
  - Laundry Plant Upgrades
  - Pipe and Equipment Insulation
  - Water Conservation
  - Solar Water Heaters
  - Domestic Water Heaters
  - Walk-in Cooler Controls
  - New Windows
  - New Roofs
  - Building Envelope
  - Variable Speed Pumps
  - Solar PV Systems
2. The appropriations set forth in paragraph 1 above are and shall be contingent upon the approval by the City Council of general obligation bonds for such purposes (the amount appropriated to be adjusted to reflect the principal amount of bonds or notes so authorized) and the issuance and delivery of such bonds or notes in anticipation thereof for such purposes. The foregoing appropriations shall also be applied to issuance costs for such bonds (or notes in anticipation thereof).
3. The Director of Finance is authorized, in her discretion, to reallocate proceeds of the Bonds or notes between and among the various energy control measures listed above, provided that such reallocation with respect to any single capital improvement or item of capital

equipment shall not exceed the limits established under Article VII, Section 16 of the City Charter.
