**ORDER DECLARING TOWER OF SONG FESTIVAL**

**ORDERED**, that Saturday, May 23, 2009, is hereby declared "Tower of Song" Festival, to be held in Congress Square area, from 10:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. with a rain date of Sunday, May 24, 2009;

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, the City Manager is authorized to grant permits to the Tower of Song, pursuant to Secs. 25-26 through 25-30 of the Portland City Code, for the following activities:

Live music at 602 Congress Street and use of Congress Square for approximately 20 artists and craft vendors.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the musicians are permitted to play live from the top floor of the historical Schwartz Building (602 Congress Street) and to project their music via a PA system from the windows to the streets below.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that 8 parking spaces shall be reserved along Congress Street and High Street by Congress Square for the purpose of unloading vendor equipment and goods.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is hereby authorized to issue a revocable permit under §§25-26 -- 25-30 of the Portland City Code to the Tower of Song subject to the following conditions:

\* Under no circumstances may alcoholic beverages be sold on City of Portland rights-of-way in the festival area during said event;

\* The Tower of Song shall defend and indemnify the City and hold it harmless from and against all claims arising out of activities during said event, and shall take out and maintain public liability insurance coverage in the amount of at least \$400,000 combined single limit for personal or bodily injury, death or property damage and naming the City as an additional insured thereon for said purposes;

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED**, that the City Manager is also authorized to issue such other temporary licenses as may be required by the Portland City Code, provided that all other

applicable requirements of said Code have been met regarding the operation of said festival/event.
