



14: 4-601.11.(A): C: Equipment food-contact surfaces and utensils are not clean to sight and touch.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** 1) SLICER HAS FOOD RESIDUE ON IT. 2) PREP SINK IS NOT CLEANED AFTER USE.

21: 3-501.17.(D): C: Date marking system used at the Eating Establishment does not meet the criteria list in code.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** ITEMS IN THE WALKIN ARE NOT DATE MARKED.

37: 3-305.11: N: Food not protected from contamination during storage.

INSPECTOR NOTES: FOOD NOT COVERED IN THE WALKIN.

38: 2-304.11: N: Outer clothing not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: EMPLOYEES WEARING DIRTY APRONS FROM THE DAY BEFORE.

45: 4-101.11.(D): N: Utensils or equipment food contact surfaces not smooth / easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: THREADED PIPE USED AS A HANDLE ON SLICER IS NOT ALLOWED, FOOD BUILDUP IN THREADS.

47: 4-601.11.(C): C: Nonfood contact surfaces are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: 1) COOKING EQUIPMENT IS VERY GREASY- NEEDS BETTER ROUTINE CLEANING. 2) CRACKS BETWEEN TABLES ARE VERY DIRTY (FILLED WITH FOOD DEBRIS).

47: 4-602.13: N: Non-food contact surfaces are not cleaned at a frequency necessary to preclude accumulation of soil residues.

INSPECTOR NOTES: TIMER DIAL USED IN PREP KITCHEN NOT CLEANED- HEAVY FOOD RESIDE BUILDUP ON IT.

53: 6-501.12: N: The physical facilities are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** NEED TO CLEAN KITCHEN WALLS AND FLOOR UNDER LINE EQUIPMENT

Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact the inspector when a violation has been addressed at 874-8772. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

“ Critical violation” means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
