

8: 6-301.12: N: Sanitary towels / hand drying device not provided for hand wash sink or lavatory.

INSPECTOR NOTES: *CORRECTED* NO PAPER TOWELS AVAILABLE AT SEVERAL HAND WASH SINKS, PIC RESTOCKED.

13: 3-302.11.(A).(2): C: Different types of Raw animal foods are not stored in a way to prevent cross contamination with each other during storage, preparation, holding, or display.

INSPECTOR NOTES: *CORRECTED* SEVERAL TYPES OF RAW ANIMAL FOOD FOUND IN COOLERS STORED INCORRECTLY, PIC CORRECTED, DISCUSSED PROPER FOOD STORAGE.

14: 4-602.11.(E): N: Non-potentially hazardous food contact surfaces are not cleaned with proper frequency.

INSPECTOR NOTES: BASEMENT BAR SODA GUNS NEED TO BE CLEANED.

14: 4-602.12.(C): N: The cavities and door seals of microwave ovens are not cleaned with proper frequency.

INSPECTOR NOTES: KITCHEN MICROWAVE NEEDS TO BE THOROUGHLY CLEANED. DRIED FOOD MATTER.

37: 3-305.11: N: Food not protected from contamination during storage.

INSPECTOR NOTES: BAGS OF SUGAR AND BAGS OF RICE ARE STORED DIRECTLY ON THE FLOOR, FOOD NEEDS TO BE STORED 6 INCHES OR HIGHER OFF THE FLOOR.

41: 3-304.12: N: Improper between-use storage of in-use utensils.

INSPECTOR NOTES: SCOOPS WITHOUT HANDLES ARE STORED IN FOOD CONTAINERS, NEED TO HAVE SCOOPS WITH HANDLES FACING UPWARD IF STORED IN FOOD, NEED TO PROTECT FOOD FROM POSSIBLE CONTAMINATION.

43: 4-903.11.(D): N: Single-Service or Single-Use Articles stored less than 6 inches off floor using dollies, pallets, racks, or skids not kept in closed packages.

INSPECTOR NOTES: PAPER GOODS IN THE BASEMENT STORAGE AREA ARE STORED ON THE FLOOR, NEED TO BE STORED 6 INCHES OR HIGHER OFF THE FLOOR.

43: 4-904.11.(A).(C): N: Single service/use items are improperly handled/stored/displayed/dispensed.

INSPECTOR NOTES: PLASTIC UTENSILS NEED TO BE DISPENSED WITH THE HANDLES FACING UPWARD, NEED TO BE PROTECTED FROM POSSIBLE CONTAMINATION.

47: 4-601.11.(B): C: Food contact surfaces of cooking equipment not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: *REPEAT* FLAT TOP GRILLS IN THE BASEMENT NEED TO BE THOROUGHLY CLEANED, FOOD DEBRIS IN THE CORNERS.



INSPECTOR NOTES: NEED TO CLEAN COOLER DOOR HANDLES, DOOR GASKETS, COOLER RACKS, SHELVES, TABLES, EQUIPMENT, ETC., NEED TO BE CLEANED DAILY OR SOONER IF REQUIRED.

53: 6-501.12: N: The physical facilities are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: *REPEAT* FLOORS IN THE KITCHEN AND WALK-IN COOLER NEED TO BE DEEP CLEANED, HEAVY GREASE AND FOOD DEBRIS BUILDUP.

54: 6-501.14.(A): N: Ventilation not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: HOOD SYSTEM NEEDS TO BE CLEANED, UNABLE TO DETERMINE LAST CLEANING, NO SERVICE STICKER FOUND.



Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact the inspector when the critical violation has been addressed at 207-756-8016. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

“ Critical violation” means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:


Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
