Observations and Corrective Actions

Violations cited in this report must be corrected within the time frames below, or as stated in sections 8-405.11 and 8-406.11 of the Food Code

14: 4-501.114.(A).(1): C: Dishes/utensils are not being sanitized in water with the correct chlorine sanitizer concentration.

INSPECTOR NOTES: DISH MACHINE CHLORINE RINSE IS 0 PPM, NEEDS TO BE 50-99 PPM, DO NOT USE THE DISH MACHINE UNTIL CORRECTED.

14: 4-601.11.(A): C: Equipment food-contact surfaces and utensils are not clean to sight and touch.

INSPECTOR NOTES: SODA GUN NEEDS TO BE CLEANED.

26: 7-102.11: C: Working containers used for storing POISONOUS OR TOXIC MATERIALS such as cleaners and SANITIZERS taken from bulk supplies are not clearly and individually identified with the common name of the material.

INSPECTOR NOTES: UNLABELED CHEMICAL SPRAY BOTTLES FOUND IN THE KITCHEN, NEED TO HAVE THE CHEMICAL NAME ON THE BOTTLE.

34: 4-204.112.(B).(C): N: Cold or hot holding not equipped with integral or permanently fixed temperature measuring device.

INSPECTOR NOTES: UNABLE TO LOCATE THERMOMETERS IN ALL COOLERS WITH PHF, NEED TO BE LOCATED NEAR THE DOOR.

36: 6-202.13: N: Insect control devices are improperly designed and constructed / located.

INSPECTOR NOTES: NEED TO REMOVE FLY STRIPS HANGING IN THE KITCHEN, DISCUSSED.

41: 3-304.12: N: Improper between-use storage of in-use utensils.

INSPECTOR NOTES: SCOOPS WITHOUT HANDLES ARE LEFT IN DRY FOOD CONTAINERS, NEED TO HAVE HANDLES FACING UPWARD IF STORED IN FOOD BINS.

43: 4-903.11.(D): N: Single-Service or Single-Use Articles stored less than 6 inches off floor using dollies, pallets, racks, or skids not kept in closed packages.

INSPECTOR NOTES: CASES OF PAPER GOODS ARE STORED DIRECTLY ON THE BASEMENT FLOOR NEED TO BE STORED 6 INCHES OR HIGHER OFF THE FLOOR.

53: 6-501.12: N: The physical facilities are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: *REPEAT* KITCHEN FLOOR UNDER AND BEHIND COOKING EQUIPMENT NEEDS TO BE CLEANED, GREASE AND FOOD DEBRIS BUILDUP.

Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact the inspector when the critical violation has been addressed at 207-756-8016. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

“Critical violation” means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
