

14: 4-501.114.(A).(1): C: Dishes/utensils are not being sanitized in water with the correct chlorine sanitizer concentration.

INSPECTOR NOTES: DISH MACHINE SANITIZER IS NOT PRIMMED, HOSE IS BLOWING AIR. THE DETERGENT CONTAINER IS ALSO EMPTY. PIC REPLACED SOAP. NEED TO SANITIZE IN 3-BAY AND CALL ECOLAB FOR SERVICE..

14: 4-601.11.(A): C: Equipment food-contact surfaces and utensils are not clean to sight and touch.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** 1) CAN OPENER, SLICER AND FRY CUTTER NOT CLEANED PROPERLY AFTER USE. 2) ICE MACHINE NEEDS CLEANING.

23: 3-603.11.(B): C: Consumer advisory does not contain proper warning of raw or undercooked animal foods.

INSPECTOR NOTES: NEED TO PLACE AN ASTERISK NEXT TO CEASAR DRESSING IN MENU THAT CONTAINS RAW EGGS.

34: 4-204.112.(A): N: Temperature measuring device not properly located.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** UNABLE TO LOCATE THERMOMETERS IN THE FRONT OFF ALL COLD UNITS BY THE DOOR.

45: 4-501.12: N: Cutting surfaces not easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: CUTTING BOARDS THAT ARE STAINED AND ARE NO LONGER CLEANABLE NEED REPLACING.

47: 4-602.13: N: Non-food contact surfaces are not cleaned at a frequency necessary to preclude accumulation of soil residues.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **CORRECTED** HAND SINK IN UPSTAIRS KITCHEN NEEDS CLEANING.

53: 6-101.11.(A): N: Indoor surfaces are not properly constructed as to be smooth, durable, and easily cleanable or constructed of nonabsorbent material in areas of moisture.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** BASEMENT PREP AREA AND WALKIN FLOORS NEED TO BE RE-SURFACED AND CLEANED.

54: 6-501.14.(A): N: Ventilation not clean.

Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact the inspector when a violation has been addressed at 874-8772. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

“ Critical violation” means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
